
Port Notice 8/17 Safety Exclusion Zones at LNG Facilities – Port of Gladstone

Take notice that safety exclusion zones exist at LNG facilities in the Port of Gladstone whenever an LNG ship is berthed at the facility.

Persons and vessels must not enter, stop or anchor within 220 metres of the Australia Pacific LNG (APLNG) and Queensland Curtis LNG (QCLNG) loading manifold (as depicted below) unless authorised to do so by Gladstone Ports Corporation Ltd or the LNG facility.

Persons and vessels must not enter, stop or anchor within 180 metres of the Gladstone LNG (GLNG) Loading Manifold (as depicted below) unless authorised to do so by Gladstone Ports Corporation Ltd or the LNG facility.


Failure to comply with this port notice is an offence against Section 282J of the Transport Infrastructure Act 1994 (Qld). Maximum Penalty – 100 Penalty Units.
